* BCU (UKCC) - A comparison of the BCU award standards completed in March 2016 due to the 2007 changes to their framework. The "BCU" web site and the overseeing body "British Canoeing" web site was referred to and some anomalies on information, relating to the Coach Levels 4 & 5 awards was found. There is no longer a Level 5 Coach but the "BCU" site still has references to it and they will continue recognising pre 2007 awards. A very useful resource is the "BCU Terms of Reference for Coaches and Leaders" template outlining the qualification framework, which helps give a clear picture of the scheme and refers to the old awards as, BCU (old scheme) & the current awards BCU (UKCC).
