Despite the ongoing uncertainty there were many successes for NZOIA and its members this year:


- 278 additional qualifications were gained representing a 94% pass rate
- 4 disciplines were reviewed

Additionally, we know that NZOIA members played a key role in providing quality outdoor recreation and education experiences to over 250,000 people over the last year, a massive and important contribution to Aotearoa at a time when wellbeing, connection and staying active are so important.

Heading into the 2020/2021 financial year the board approved a deficit budget to maintain the viability of NZOIA through challenging times. Our congratulations to the team on producing a \$10k surplus, due in part to maintaining good course and assessment numbers alongside tight control of expenses.

For 2021-2022 the board have again approved a deficit budget as we continue to project a lower level of income due to a reduction in membership and assessment fees as a result of Covid-19, compared to the peaks of 2019/2020. And we work to complete projects we began last year.

Our thanks to SportNZ for their ongoing support of the work NZOIA members do with rangatahi, and their additional support with one off funding for specific projects post Covid. We were pleased to receive the feedback below from the SportNZ team after a busy year:

"Despite the challenges and limitations of COVID-19 and subsequent lockdowns the New Zealand Outdoor Instructors Association (NZOIA) has done a great job of supporting outdoor organisations and individuals through such a challenging time, as well as maintaining an important qualification system to enable safe participation. Your in-depth understanding of your members and your sector enabled you to adapt your offerings to help them, as well as ensuring NZOIA's survival."

We look forward to continuing to work with SportNZ and believe the recently released 'Active Recreation for Rangatahi Plan 2021-2024' In an important step in recognising and strengthening the role active recreation plays in the lives of our rangatahi.

With the support and encouragement of NZOIA members we also began our journey to better understand and embrace Te Ao Māori. Thanks to Natalie Thomson for helping us to discover where this journey could start. Karllie Clifton joined NZOIA Board during this time and has also been encouraging our Te Ao Māori development by laying down a few te reo Māori challenges to the board. We have a second workshop planned in December to continue this journey.

Alongside these successes many NZOIA members will understand the increased workload that comes with operating a business or organisation in a Covid environment, and this has been no different for NZOIA. On behalf of the NZOIA Board I'd like to recognise and thank the NZOIA team of Deb, Penny, Sonya, Pip and Naomi for their incredible work over the last year.

The team have managed NZOIA business as usual through several alert level changes. Kept on top of increased investment applications due to a shorter funding period. Managed a number of additional projects. And kept us all well informed throughout this period resulting in over 6000 member visits to the NZOIA website for Covid related information.

Our thanks also to the TSC; Sash Nukada, Keith Riley and Penny; the plus side of some of the challenges faced in the last year has been good excuse to spend more time talking to this team. This left me with increased feeling of gratitude to the many hours of volunteer service the TSC provide to NZOIA, and their well-considered approach.

Finally, thank you to the NZOIA Board; Matt Barker, Travis Donoghue, Jo Thompson, Tim Wills and Dallis Waters and Karllie Clifton who we welcomed in 2021, for your continued work and commitment to the Association.

# **NZOIA Management Report**

# 2020/2021

#### Tēnā koutou

Well we thought 2019/2020 was one out of the box with the impact of COVID-19 knocking the outdoor sector about and putting a lot of our members in tricky financial and employment situations, but then it came back to bite us again leading to the cancellation of Symposium. Hopefully by the time you get to read this we will have just completed the highly anticipated 2021 Symposium, if not we have COVID to thank for that.

Despite the intervention of COVID and the impact it had on our courses and qualification numbers, the team of Penny, Sonya, Pip and Naomi have been busy rearranging courses, keeping you updated on what COVID meant from a delivery perspective for you and a close eye on our finances. This is on top of everything else they do to achieve their annual business plan and budget deliverables. Great effort team!

Our 'no courses cancelled' policy continued to provide you with greater certainty that once enrolled, your assessment or course would go ahead regardless of numbers. The exception to this of course is when there were COVID restrictions.

Strategic planning work in June saw the Board sign off on a tighter vision for NZOIA - 'creating positive change through excellence in outdoor leadership' and our commitment to Te Ao Māori through a commitment statement and work plan for the next two years. The commitment statement reads:

NZOIA embraces the bicultural heritage of Aotearoa New Zealand. We value tangata whenua and recognise the intrinsic relationship with Te Taiao (the natural world). We are committed to growing our mātauranga (knowledge) and māramatanga (understanding) of the cultural concepts and values of Te Ao Māori.





NZOIA representatives presented at each of Recreation Aotearoa's regional hui. These are organised by Jen Riley in her role as Outdoors Programme Manager with Recreation Aotearoa. These are worthwhile hui and I encourage you all to attend, both for an opportunity to network with your peers across your own region but also to hear what is going on in the sector that may impact on your work. If you have any advocacy issues you want addressed it gives you an opportunity to raise these first hand with Sam Newton, Advocacy Manager for Recreation Aotearoa and discuss them at the hui.

Jen also deserves a special thank you for the contribution she continues to give to the production of the Quarterly magazine.

We had a good response to our call for new Assessors with more applicants, of a very high calibre, than positions available. It's great to see the commitment of so many of our members to ensure the quality of the NZOIA qualification system is maintained. Congratulations to all those successful applicants and a special thank you to our existing Assessors for your continued support.

With the help of a number of willing volunteers we have also been able to get through some note-worthy pieces of work:



The Board establishes a technical advisory committee to advise on standards and syllabus.

NZOIA's staff consist of three full time  $(2 \times 0.8, 1 \times 0.9)$  staff (Assessment Coordinator, Operations Manager and Business Manager), and one part-time administration staff member (0.5). Recreation Aotearoa provides Executive Services to NZOIA.

NZOIA contracts assessors to deliver training, revalidation and assessment workshops, and to carry out project work.

# **Statement of Accounting Policies**

# New Zealand Outdoor Instructors Association For the year ended 30 June 2021

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

#### **Income Tax**

New Zealand Outdoor Instructors Association is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

#### **Bank Accounts and Cash**

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

#### **Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
